## Message from our EGMHA President

As summer comes quickly to an end, and classes have started again, we begin to set our sights on a new hockey season. Hopefully the kids have had a good break away from the arena and have been involved in other activities, so they can look at hockey with fresh interest. As the summer sun sets earlier every day, the volunteers running your association have been busy getting ready for what should be an excellent season. I'd like to share with you a few of the changes coming for this new year.

We have two significant program changes that we are trying this year. Firstly, we are introducing a Juvenile Local League program for the first time. This team will allow our otherwise graduating players (born in 1998) to continue for one more year of recreational hockey. Interest within EGMHA is strong so far, and we hope that other centres share a similar enthusiasm.

At the opposite end of the spectrum is our new Tyke program. Until this year, we have had an initiation division catering to 4, 5 and 6 year olds, which occasionally meant that players were doing the same skills development drills for three years. We've heard the feedback and have introduced a new Tyke division catering (generally) to the 6-year old group, giving them a chance to experience game play earlier in a development-oriented environment. We feel this will preserve the very important initiation program for 4 and 5 year olds but will give game-play experience earlier, ultimately strengthening our Novice division and also keeping the interest level high.

We were very pleased with the advancement of our referees last year through mentorship, supervision, and development programs. We are again this year investing in our referees with more development opportunities and active feedback. We hope to share some feedback on this over the coming year.

One thing that is very important to us is ensuring a healthy, appropriate, relationship between referees, parents and coaches that is free of abuse and harassment. Despite the Parental Respect in Sport introduced two years ago, we still feel there is more we can do to educate people and encourage appropriate behaviour. This starts with open conversation and grows from there. We look forward to continued improvement over the coming season on this front.

The OMHA (our parent association) has similarly introduced changes to the coach certification process to further improve the caliber of the coaches. In particular, the introduction of a field evaluation process to observe and formally supervise coaches as part of their certification process is a positive change. Doug Westland who has been a long-time member in our centre has been accredited as a Field Evaluator and will be working on this and other coach-development activities over the coming year.

Last year, we were pleased with the financial support of sponsors and donations, which was higher than expected and also had a successful spring Tournament. We are looking forward to using these funds for coach development aids, first aid kits, clinics and other welcome investments to directly assist our association. We are again the grateful recipients of a \$4000 contribution by the Dunsmuir Dream Foundation which will sustain this investment for this year as well.

I hope you all share my eager anticipation to see that first puck drop and those first cheers of excitement. I look forward to seeing familiar faces, and meeting many new ones at the rink.

## **Custom Mouth Guard Clinic**

#### Saturday Sept 17th 8:00am to 2:00pm

**Dental Professionals from the Susan's Smile** <u>Centre</u> will be on-site at the EG Sports Complex and will take a mould of your player's teeth.

A custom fit mouth guard is fabricated while you wait (usually within 1-3 hours). Once it is

completed the fit is checked and adjustments are made on the spot.



Mouth Guards must be picked up same day. A protective case is included in the cost.

The Ontario Minor Hockey Association has mandated that one parent per family must complete the online "Respect In Sport" – Parent Program in order for their child to be rostered to an EGMHA team. See the link below for instructions. If you completed the course previously you do NOT need to take it again. If you are registering a child for the first time and have taken the course you will need to add the child to your profile. This re-

quirement also applies to any Team official that



may have already completed a previous Respect in Sport program.

## Did you know?

Children are more sensitive to the effects of a concussion and may need to have a longer period of rest prior to returning to activity and the sport.

A concussion is a disturbance in brain function caused by direct or indirect force to the head. It results in a variety of non-specific signs and/or symptoms, and most often does not involve loss of consciousness. While the majority (80-90%) of concussions resolve in a short period (7-10 days), the recovery time frame may be longer in children and adolescents.

Holland Landing Health Centre has extended an offer for EGMHA Players to have Baseline Concussion Testing completed using the Sports Concussion Assessment Tool – 3rd Edition (SCAT 3) for \$10/ player.

By implementing a preseason baseline score, the SCAT 3 can then be used on the sidelines if a head injury or suspected concussion occurs during practices and games. These comparative scores can assist in the recognition and diagnosis of concussions, and serve as an objective measure to guide return to play protocols.
